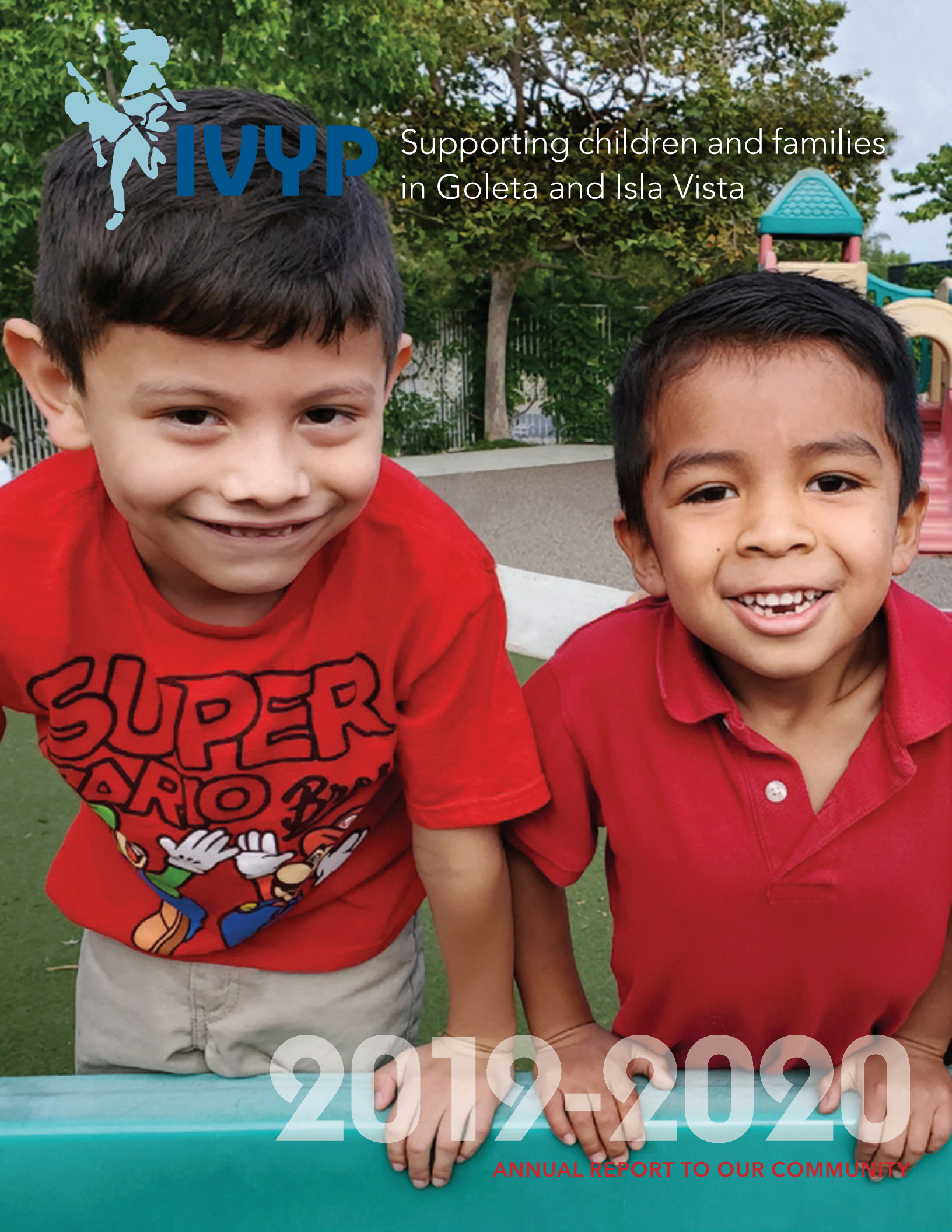

# From our Executive Director



**IN JANUARY**, our board and staff adopted a strategic plan to guide our work for the next few years. We articulated our values and fleshed out a theory of change. Little did we know how important our strategic plan would prove to be.

On March 13, 2020, we closed our direct child serving programs and immediately increased the direct family support we provide. Food distribution increased by more than 400%. Families were in crisis and they were turning to us. With so much need and uncertainty we turned to our strategic plan for guidance and inspiration.

As we transitioned to virtual learning in both our Children's Center and School-Aged Enrichment

programs, we needed to address the digital divide—in our families and in our staff. We partnered with Equalitech to provide devices and training to our staff members who needed scaffolding to be able to support students. Our Family Resource Center not only quadrupled the number of people receiving direct support, but our Family Advocates learned new skills in order to support families' parenting and mental health needs.

**Our values and our vision guide us every step of the way.**

I'm proud of how effective we have been in pursuing our mission and our values in the face of unprecedented challenges. As we continue to grow our impact, I invite you to join us.

# From our Staff

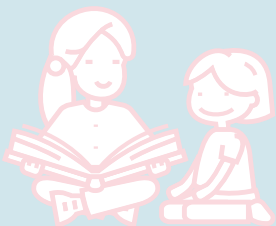

IVYP's **FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER** mitigates the effects of poverty, racism, and trauma by strengthening families. Our FRC proactively responds to community members' needs through classes, education, resource, and referral.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, IVYP's Family Resource Center met an unanticipated challenge by providing virtual and in person support to families experiencing crisis.

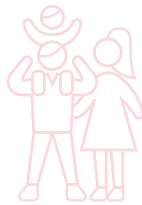

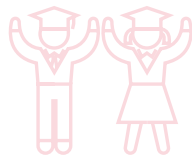
## To support children through COVID-19, IVYP teachers:

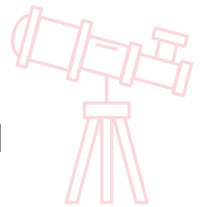
In March, our school age staff sprang to action to research, test, and launch a Kid's Corner page to provide virtual educational and recreational resources for children and caregivers.

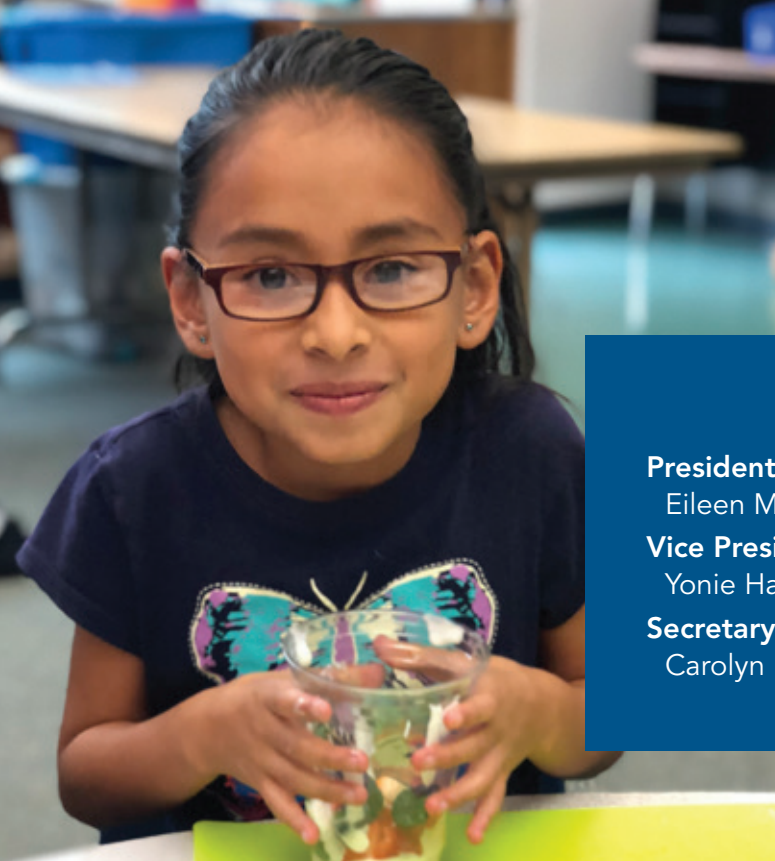

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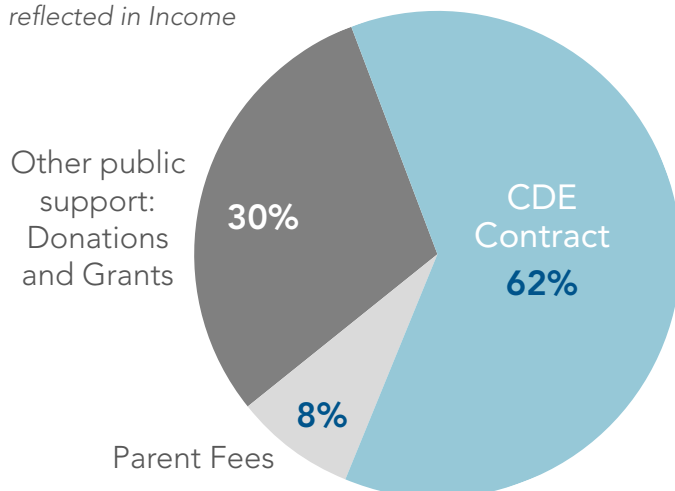

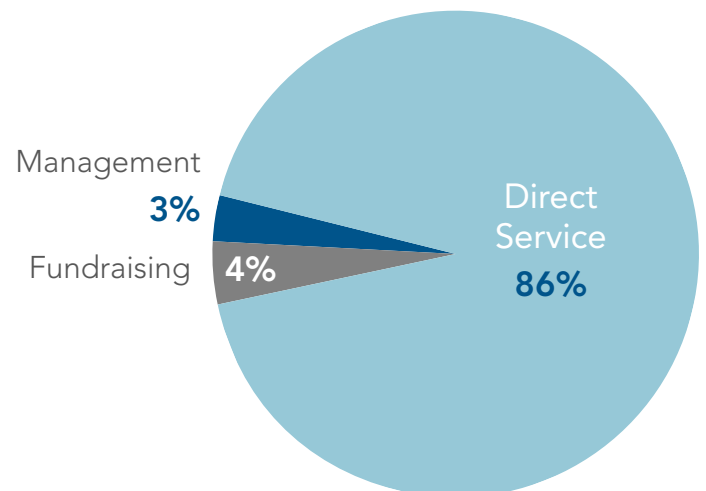
## Fiscal Year 2019-2020
